



We want to make it clear: this message does not apply to Language Kingdom students, who will be always able to submit up to a maximum of 5 assessments per day and per subject as long as they follow the rules.

Due to the high demand for Discussion Based Assessments in World History, US History, and US Government and US Economics these last days, from now onwards, in these subjects, students will need to have an oral contact DBA with their teacher for only half of the units in the course and the other half they will be required to complete an alternative written assessment. This will help to reduce the waiting time for DBAs whilst still checking students' knowledge acquired in the unit, at the same time as helping the students move forward in their courses.



Also, as our clocks went back in Spain last week, **the time difference now between Spain and Florida**, where American High School is located, **is 6 hours again**. As an example, 15:00 hours in Spain is 09:00 hours in Florida.
